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Things to keep in mind for our students in Year 10

- ▶ Soon, students will need to decide if they wish to be on a university pathway or an industry pathway.
- ▶ This decision will be greatly influenced by their grades on the Semester One report. Students need to meet the pre-requisites in order to enter a particular course.
- ▶ ATAR students must select at least five ATAR courses.
- ▶ VET students must select a Certificate course, plus General subjects

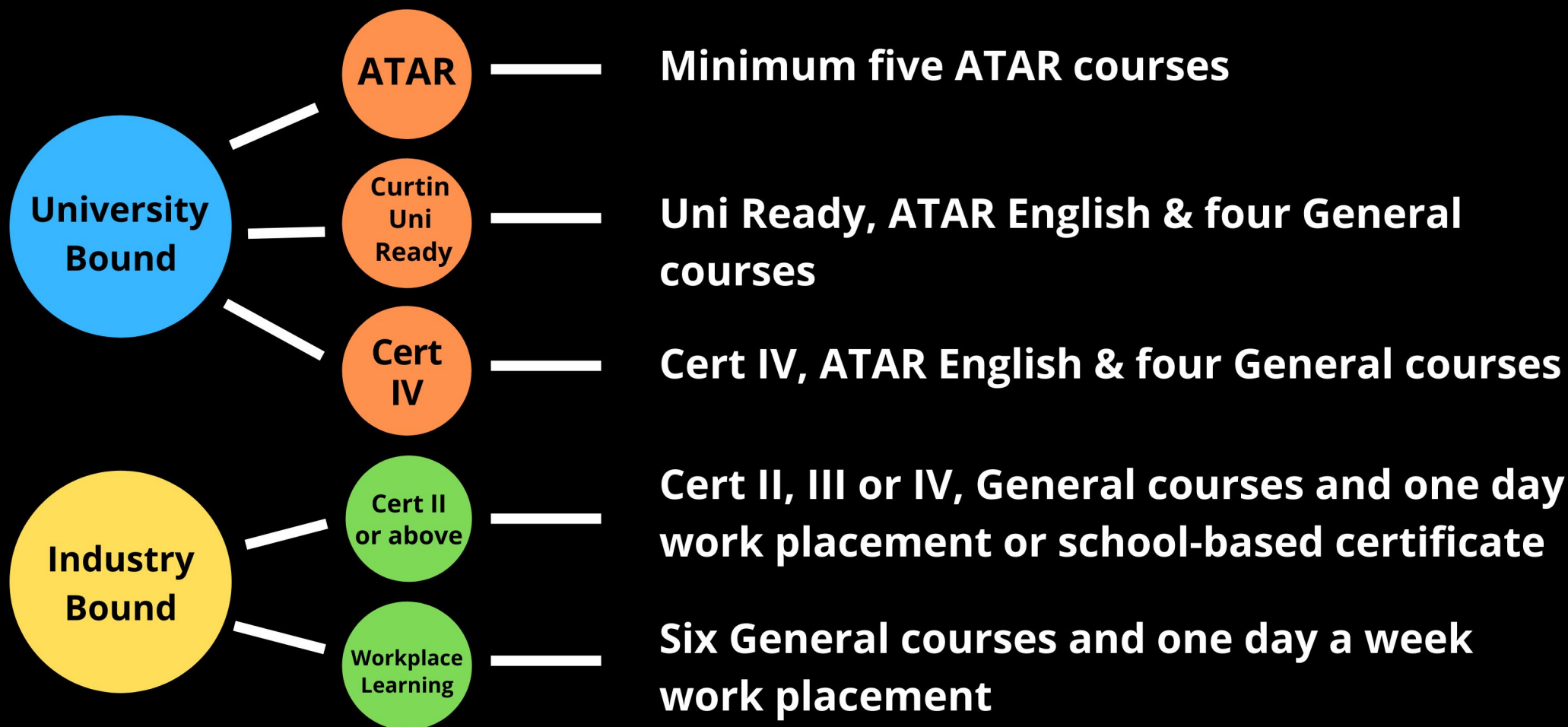


Decision Time....

Year 11 signals the beginning of studies that will enable students to move beyond school to a variety of tertiary destinations or into the workplace. The courses chosen by a student should be based upon:

- ▶ Academic ability - 'Have you met the prerequisite for a given course?'
- ▶ Interests - Courses you enjoy.
- ▶ Future Intentions - Courses that maximise your future options.

Some Frequently Used Terms...

- ▶ WACE - Western Australian Certificate of Education (presented on the successful completion of courses at the end of Year 12). The aim is for all students to achieve a WACE.
- ▶ WASSA - All students receive a Western Australian Statement of Student Achievement when they complete Year 12.
- ▶ COURSE - An area of study that a student wishes to pursue. For example: Drama, Mathematics, Certificate II in Business.



Achievement Standard ...

- To receive a WACE, students must achieve at least 14 C grades over Years 11 and 12.
- Minimum of 6 C grades (i.e. C grades in three subjects) must be achieved in Year 12.
- Have demonstrated a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy (i.e. OLNA).

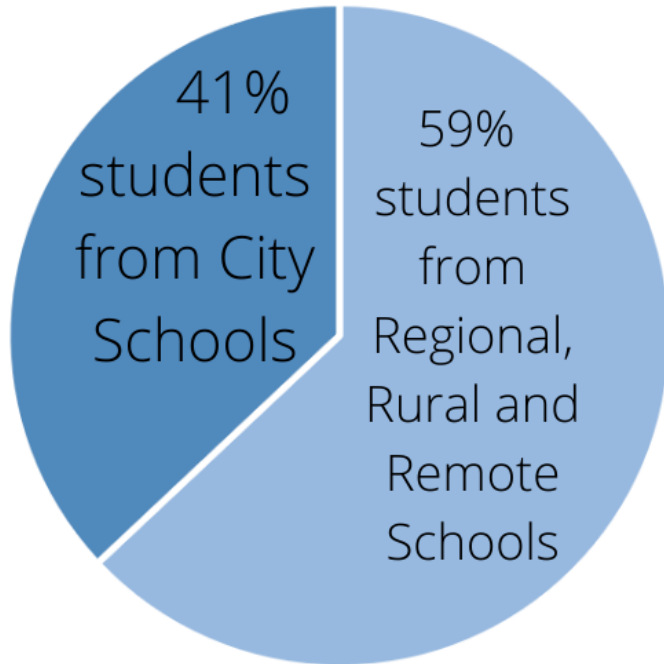

How does ViSN work?



5 Periods a Week

- 1 Teams Call lesson with your teacher and class.
- 4 lessons working in OneNote.



Students use OneNote and Teams to demonstrate learning and work collaboratively with their classmates.



Teachers are available daily to answer questions and provide feedback on student work.

Assessments are administered by the Mentors in schools and sent to the teachers for marking and feedback.

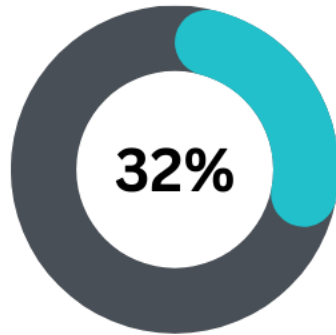

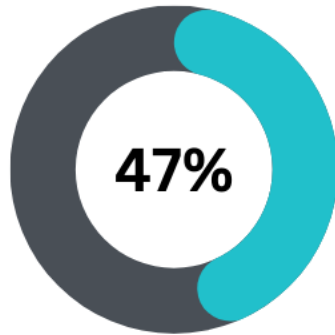

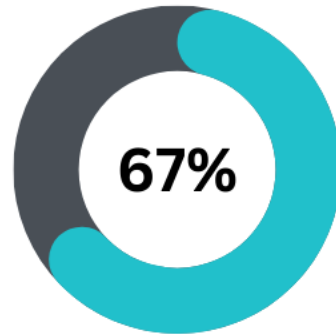
Class of 2022 Academic Achievement



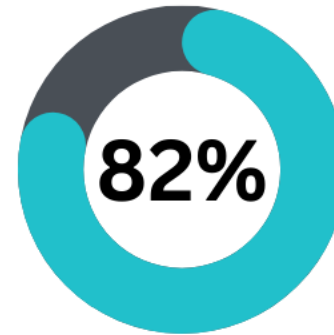

Industry Bound options:

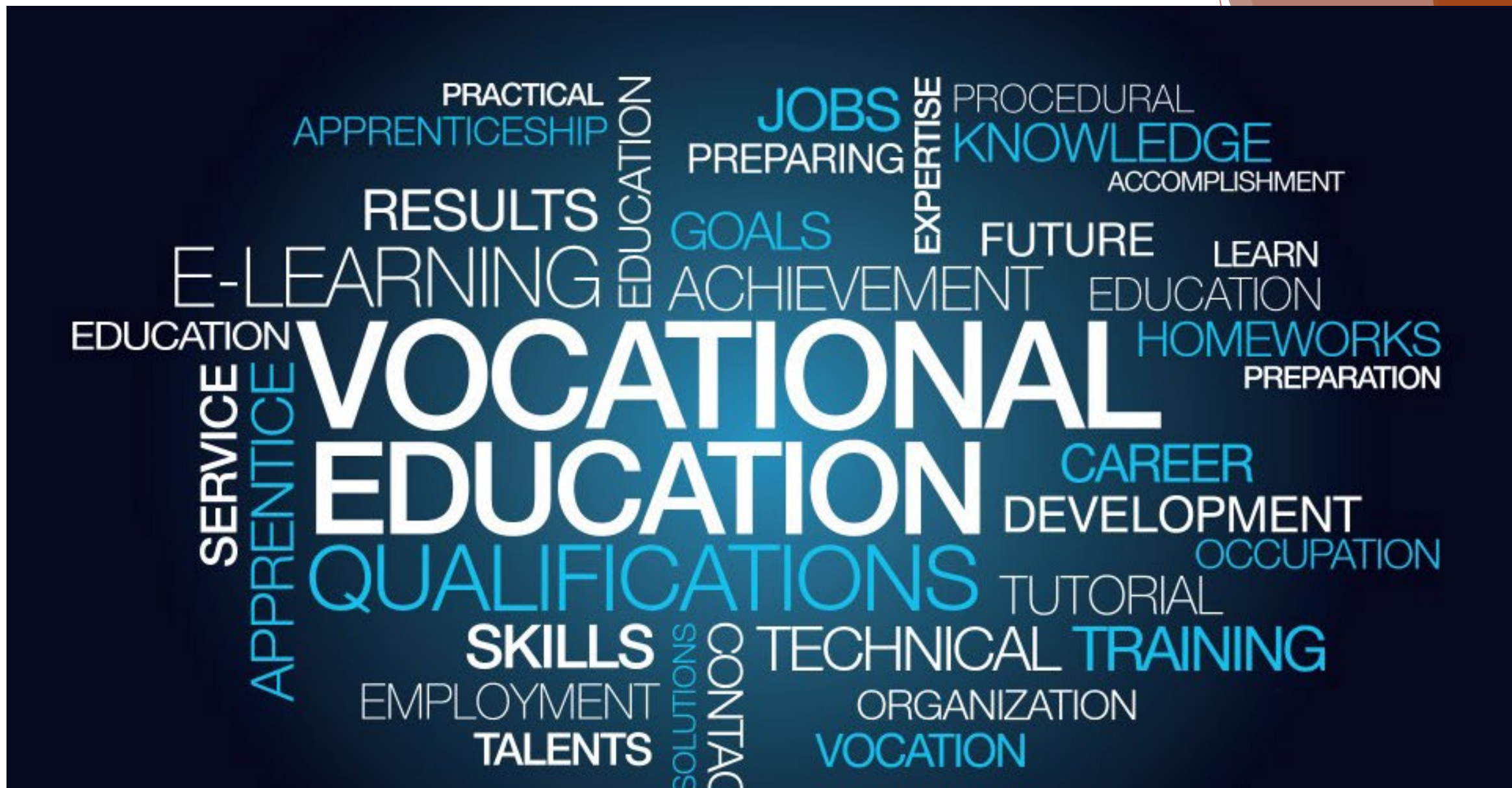
- Select 6 subjects + Certificate / or / 6 subjects including in school certificates (Sport & Recreation / Outdoor Recreation)
- Certificate II / III / IV courses - RTO's
 - Delivery (face-to-face / online)
 - Support (through school / trainers)
 - One day a week work placement (related to certificate choice)
 - School-based traineeship options
- Workplace Learning
 - One day a week work placement
 - Every 55 hours = 1 point towards WACE

Industry bound students also have the option to enrol in a University after Year 12.
